We will also have the blessing of expectant mothers immediately following the 9:00am Mass at the Blessed Mother's Altar.

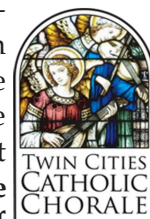

W.A. Mozart, *Spatzenmesse*, K 220

The *Spatzenmesse* (*Sparrow Mass*) was composed in Salzburg by W.A. Mozart (1756-1791) in 1776. The nickname is derived from recurring violin figures in the Sanctus and Benedictus, which resemble birds chirping.
