PASTOR'S COLUMN February 22 – The Feast of the Chair of St Peter

And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.9

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter, a feast day easily misconstrued without some examination. One may ask, why are we celebrating a chair? The chair has been venerated since the early days of the Church because St. Peter, on whom Christ said He would build His Church, sat on it whenever he presided over and preached to an assembly of the faithful in Rome. To preach and teach while seated was an ancient custom and something even Jesus did when preaching in a synagogue. We could view this feast as an opportunity to venerate another saintly relic, but this particular feast also allows us as a church to celebrate the foundation Christ gave us in Peter, especially the teaching office of the Bishop of Rome. We are unified as a church based on the apostolic succession that followed from our first pope, St. Peter. Pope Leo XIII said in his Encyclical Satis Cognitum:

[I]t is clear that by the will and command of God the Church rests upon St. Peter, just as a building rests on its foundation. Now the proper nature of a foundation is to be a principle of cohesion for the various parts of the building. It must be the necessary condition of stability and strength. Remove it and the whole building falls. It is consequently the office of St. Peter to support the Church, and to guard it in all its strength and indestructible unity.

The actual chair of St. Peter is located in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. For many years in the early church, the pope would sit on the chair to receive the neophytes as they walked from the baptistry to be confirmed by the Pope. In the Vatican today, you can see the sculpture that Pope Alexander VII commissioned Italian artist Bernini to enclose the original oak chair of the Bishop by wrapping it with a bronze covering. It took Bernini six years to complete the sculpture that creates the illusion that the chair is suspended in thin air.

As we approach this feast day that celebrates a specific chair, let us take a moment to reflect on the foundations in our lives: our foundation as a church, as a family, as an individual. May we find stability and strength in solid foundations.

Saint Peter, pray for us.
