

Parish Celebration of 40 Hours – March 8 - 10

This longstanding tradition of our parish is a beautiful and fitting way to celebrate Laetare Sunday and, most importantly, to worship Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. The 40 Hours Devotion has its roots in Sacred Scripture where the number forty is associated with conversion, often involving trials and suffering. For example, God cleansed the earth of sin with a flood from rain that fell for forty days and forty nights at the time of Noah; the Israelites wandered through the desert for forty years; Christ fasted and prayed in the desert for forty days. It is traditionally held that Christ's body rested in the tomb for forty hours. I invite you to deeper conversion by spending even just a small part of our 40 Hours before the Blessed Sacrament. Jesus is longing to spend time with you!

Please consider signing-up for an hour of Adoration from Friday, March 8th after the 8:45am Mass through the Solemn Closing at the 3:00pm Mozart Vespers on Sunday, March 10th. Sign-up sheets are located in the vestibule of the Church, the East Main entrance, in the Chapel and in the parish office.


