ble for purchase in the parish office throughout this Easter season.



Composer Charles Gounod (1818-1893) was a practicing Catholic who as a youth contemplated becoming a priest. The Messe Solennelle was dedicated by the composer to Saint Cecilia, the patron saint of musicians, who like Saint Agnes was martyred in early Christian Rome.

The Twin Cities Catholic Chorale is a non-profit organization that depends solely on the generosity of its patrons.
