CHORALE AND ORCHESTRA NOTES

Anton Bruckner, Missa Solemnis (1854)

Bruckner composed the Missa Solemnis for the installation of Friedrich Mayer as abbot of St. Florian Monastery on 14 September 1854. Stylistically the Mass, in the line of Beethoven's Masses, displays Bruckner's confrontation with tradition. Multiple influences afford the work some heterogeneity, in which J. S. Bach's technique of the fugue is "amalgamated" with elements of the Viennese Classical and Preclassical periods, and of the early Romantic composers like Schubert.
